From the Pastor's Desk

I get bored easily. So I can agree with one of my close friends who always likes to say around this time of year that "Easter gets boring!...Resurrection can be boring!" Now, aside from the apparent oxymoronic logic of such a statement, I would have to concur. Easter can be boring, I guess, because maybe the bottom line is that church is boring?! Maybe, heaven forbid, the sermons are boring too! Maybe Jesus and his outdated stories are boring! Maybe life *is* boring!

Something like that, I suppose, is how many of us sojourn through the Easter season, and for that matter, life. We are bored. And so "we reject the resurrection because we are looking past it for something else", said one of my professors in class one day. Think about that insightful quip for a minute. The audacity of his assertion, if true, gives me a head rush. "*We* look past the resurrection for *something else???*" What are we looking for?

It can be any number of things. A nice house, a new video game, a cute boyfriend or girlfriend, lots of money, entertainment, an exciting vacation, a cheap cell phone plan. But we look for other things too. A pain free life, lack of stress, no more car accidents, heart attacks or cancer, etc. All of these things Jesus' resurrection failed to bring about! What good was it for if it at least didn't do *some* of these things?

But while we fuss and fume, and perhaps fall asleep in our pew, God was/is doing a new thing! While we were prodigally running after self made goals and idols, Christ came running after us. While we clambered up the ladder of prestige and success, God came down into our pain, sickness and sin. "while we still were sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom. 5:8). He went to the gallows. The very last place we expected to find him. And then he rose from the dead. The very last thing we would expect after his death, because lets face it people don't come back from the dead! What an unpredictable God! But it gets even better, for he tells us now that we too can live anew, in a joy unbounded, with a peace that passes all understanding, simply by trusting in him and his forgiveness. You now have someone in your life that is trustworthy, and will walk with you through all of your darkness. This is justification by faith alone! This is the presence of God among us! This is forgiveness! This is life eternal! This is the wild, exciting, ubiquitous truth of Easter, which never, ever, ends!

And you thought church was boring! ☺

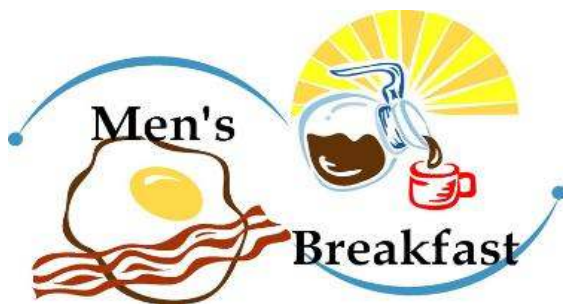

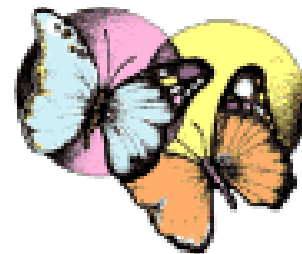

2010 High School Mission Trip

Let all that you do be done in love.

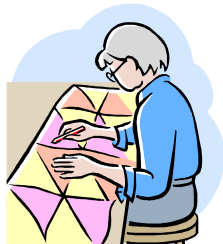

The children will be learning all about animals this month. Animals from the zoo, farms, the wild and household pets. Finding out what they should eat and where they live.

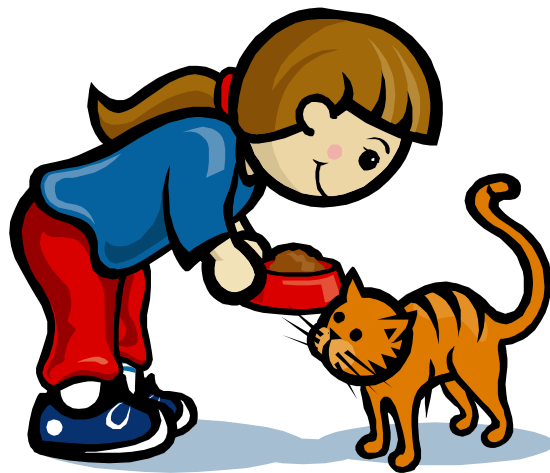
Genesis 1:25 is the verse for the month; which says:

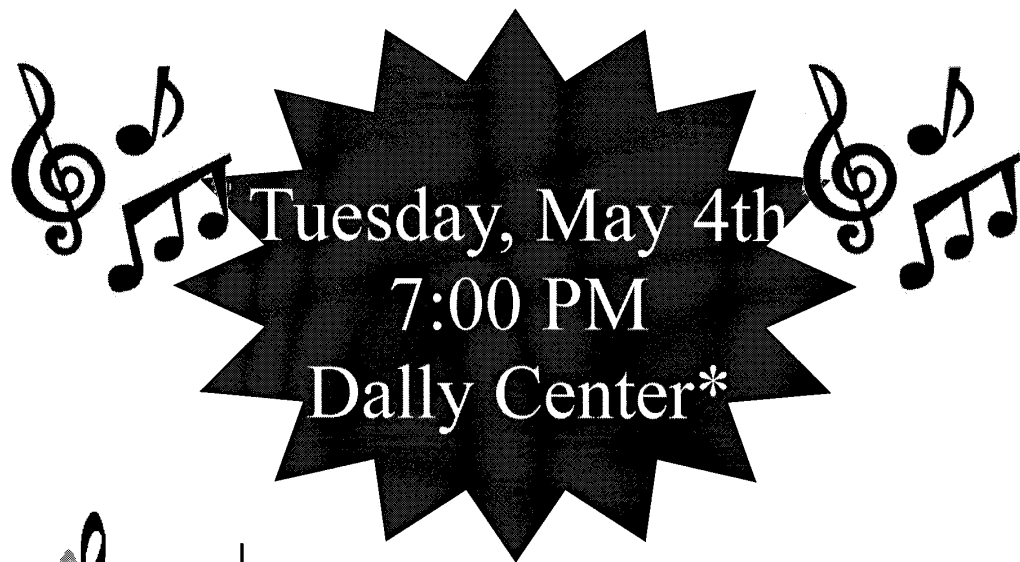

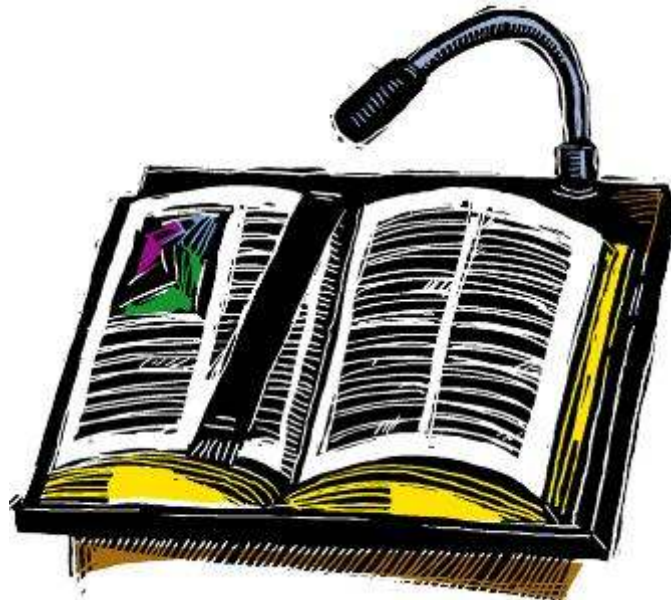
